

Laburnum Ward – Horton General Hospital

Laburnum Ward is a 28 bed acute general medical ward.

We work in four teams with a trained nurse and a clinical support worker in each team. We have a co-ordinator for each shift. Every morning at 9.15am we have a board round at the nursing station with the multidisciplinary team. We have a 'huddle' at 3.00pm to discuss any issues and updates.

Most common conditions are cardiac and respiratory, such as:

- heart failure
- myocardial infarction
- exacerbation of COPD
- pneumonia
- pulmonary emboli.
